The Dogwood Literacy Council (DLC) is a nonprofit 501c3 organization that was incorporated in July 1990. In beginning years of DLC, the primary program involved tutoring students who were working on adult basic literacy. With the high volume of immigrants living in NWA region, programs transitioned very quickly to serving students who are learning to speak English as a second language. Since then, DLC programs have evolved to meet the literacy needs of the diverse community.

WHAT WE DO

English Literacy

We offer free, small group classes and one on one tutoring at all levels for adults wishing to improve their English reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills.

Citizenship

We offer a citizenship class that helps students learn about the naturalization process and how to avoid common mistakes.

We offer a class where students learn and live out healthier lifestyle choices and are equipped to make competent health decisions for their families. This includes teaching healthy cooking skills as well as trips to Panther Health and Wellness clinic, dentist's offices or other medical professionals. These field trips aim to help our students be more prepared & willing to seek medical help when they are in need.

We are working with our current students who have preschoolers on the importance of family literacy and book ownership.

We offer classes in "Survival" Spanish to help community members communicate across linguistic barriers in Siloam Springs. This class has a fee and is used towards fundraising.







ALBA'S STORY

Alba and I met two years ago. She said she needed help getting ready for the citizenship test, which was a new experience for me, but I was ready to help. I found out very quickly how willing Alba was to put both her time and effort into this project. We'd found a booklet with 100 questions which could be on the test, and she already knew the answers to most of them. She had the knowledge, but lacked confidence, so that's what we worked on. We met twice a week, and it seemed like she knew more every time we met. She knew a lot of the answers to the questions but not why these questions were important, so we went to learn why they were in the book. Our studies fortified her confidence, which prepared her for the test. She was overjoyed, and after a year of study, she applied for the test, which she passed. I am positive she did well in every area of the test. Alba was an absolute joy to work with and I am happy I was able to help her.
